Perhaps good art is the kind of art that prompts you to speak in draft. Perhaps it is the art that requires a full heart, deep reflection, revision, rearticulation, and continued action. As we continue to embrace the adage, "Hope is for everyone" we want to thank you for challenging us, growing with us, trusting us, and showing us your unwavering support.

Hope Rep is in the early stages of developing a strategic plan that will allow us to maintain our commitment to entertain, engage, and educate. We are strengthening our education and outreach programs, expanding beyond the summer season and continuing to produce plays and musicals of the highest quality. We cannot go on this journey without you, our loyal supporters and passionate theater-goers!

I wanted to express my gratitude to Marcus Johnson, Hope Rep's Artistic Director, Lenny Banovez, Hope Rep's Producing Director, and to the entire Hope Rep company for having me back this summer. I am incredibly honored to work with these artists, designers, and production team.

Natural Shocks was a natural fit for me as a director. It evokes self-empowerment, redemption, and grappling with self-truths. Based on Shakespeare's famous "To be or not to be" soliloguy from Hamlet, Lauren Gunderson has written this tour de force, onewoman play.

Our actor, DeAnna Wright, and her understudy, Tia Hockenhull, has taken this play by the reins with their bodies, hearts, and souls. Our journey together during rehearsals was not taken lightly given the heavy source material. We formed bonds during rehearsals ensuring there was trust, kindness, and space for each other. From that comes this powerful, brutally honest, surprisingly funny, piece. There are quirky stories, confessions, a tornado, and reckonings – sorry to be vague here, but I'll let our heroine, Angela, tell you.

**DEANNA S WRIGHT\*** (Angela) is an actor/artist/educator brought up in High Springs, FL. Her educational journey includes a BA in Theatre from the University of Florida and an MFA from FSU Asolo Conservatory, where she also currently resides as a Visiting Professor of Theatre. DeAnna's work as an artist spans through theatre, film, and rhythmic afro movement. Some of DeAnna's past credits as a theatre artist include Sophie Washington in Flyin' West (Quintessence Theatre, Phila., PA), Jane Bennett in Pride and Prejudice (Creede Rep - Creed, CO), Cassandra in Sender (Urbanite Theatre SRQ, FL) and Macy in The Cake (Asolo Rep SRQ, FL). DeAnna has also found recent success in film and television, in addition to devising her own works in collaboration with other art makers. Text Work/Technique coach for Asolo Conservatory theatre another productions is exciting endeavor contributing to DeAnna's growing artistic repertoire. Stephen Michelle produces, writes, and directs for the Annual Asian-American Playwright Collective Play Festival (2020-2022), including this year's at the Starlight Square Theater in Cambridge, MA. Michelle also directed The Walking Plays (Lyric Stage), Boston Resilience Project Plays: East Boston, Nos Vemos (Speakeasy Theater), Augusta and Noble (Emerson Stage), Vietgone (Company One Theater), and Proof (with an Asian cast at Central Square Theater). Michelle won Best Costume Design for The Mountaintop by Katori Hall at the 2021 American Association Theaters Community Annual of

Festival. She received her theatre education at San Francisco State University, California State University at Long Beach, and at the National Theater of London.
